Dear Mr. Sutton,

From my mail many people of your generation feel <sup>as</sup> you do. In the same mail was a letter from a woman then 10 and she feels now as you do.

The main reason my books are not in the bookstores is that after about 100 rejections internationally for the first one I published it myself, its record proving that publishers can be dispensib~~le~~. I had to improvise distribution and wound up not being paid by most of the wholesalers. So <sup>my</sup> still order for bookstores and some book stroes order directly from us but rather few. However, we have always mailed them and we have always been listed in "Books in Print. So, any bookstore could have ordered at any time. Mostly small individual orders cost them more than they can make so most prote~~d~~ the books are not available.

Many things can account for your being troubled and there'd be something wrong with you if you were not. I think that of those many who have written me and expressed how they feel the two most troubling aspects are that such a thing could ~~happ~~ happend and ~~our~~ <sup>our</sup> government would lie about it, leaving most think <sup>by</sup> people dissatisfied and worried, and their love of the man and what they thought he wanted to do for the country and was trying to do.

I think another troubling aspect is all the books that claim to have solved the crime, each in its own fabricated way and none proven most not even tenable, which makes for even more confusion.

Honesty impels me to tell you that government records I obtained by a series of FOIA lawsuits leave it without question: the crime was never investigated and was never intended to be investigated. Thus there are no real leads to be followed and thus also you will not get what you are looking for in any of the books you have or will get get. (No theories in any of mine.)

When you refer to stumbling onto a "detail," you have no way of knowing whether it is fact of someone's invention.

Perhaps pressure continuing on the government will impell it to be honest with us at some point and perhaps the continuing interest and pressure will mitigate against it ever doing the same thing again.

Dear Mr. Weisberg,

I am writing to you because of my interest in the assassination of President Kennedy and the countless mysteries surrounding it. I have read many books on the subject in the past 20 odd years but, unfortunately I have not yet found one of yours. I have seen you on film in various documentaries and have come across your name many times in the course of my studies.

For me, this is a deeply troubling matter for reasons I am unable to fully understand. I was only 10 years old when the President was killed but as an adult I became interested in the subject and I have never gotten over it. I have a wife and family and a good career but I am still tortured everyday by this problem. It feels like if I read enough books or articles or if I see enough programs I'll finally make sense of this all or maybe even stumble across an important detail that could shed some light on things. Everywhere I go, something reminds me of the assassination, be it a wooden stockade fence, mention of anything such as a rifle, gun shot, trajectory, not to mention Ross Perot of Dallas. I took my kids to see "The Great Mouse Detective" a Walt Disney animated movie,

thinking I might temporarily get the assassination out of my mind, although just the act of going to a movie theatre paints a mental picture of the capture of Lee Harvey Oswald. So in this harmless children's movie, the hero fires a gun into several pillows, then retrieves the bullet to inspect it under a microscope! Well there I sit, probably the only person in the place thinking "CE 399".

I'm sorry this is so wordy. Please let me know how I could obtain a copy of your books. Honestly, I would be tickled to death to get a reply from you. I greatly admire the work you and others have done. I will look forward to hearing from you. Thank you for your attention to this letter.
