Magazine Urges New JFK Probe

NEW YORK, Jan. 2 (UPI) — The Saturday Evening Post said today that there should be a new inquiry into the assassination of President Kennedy because shortcomings of the Warren Commission report create "reasonable doubt . . . that Lee Harvey Oswald alone murdered the President."

An editorial in this week's Post proposes the appointment of "a fact-finding committee of indisputable impartiality, skill, experience, rectitude and concern for the truth."
