My dear Harold Weiskopf:

you are correct in your recollection that the police searches turned up live ammunition in the LFK case.

After I received your reply to my query about your statement in Case Open, p. 109, a light went on. I recalled that Marina testified that there <sup>were</sup> bullets in a small box.

My recall was also correct. The bullets were not 6.5. They may have been for the revolver: .38 caliber.

I spent all day yesterday (Oct. 18) checking. (We old ones do not have much to go on.) There was not anything about ammunition in the testimony of Rose or Stovall. Stovall Ex. H, the property list, contained no bullet item.

I shuddered. Would I <sup>have</sup> to go through all of Marino's stuff? Luck had it that I did not. The answer I was looking for can be found in her February, 1994, testimony. In that testimony she states there were no bullets in the Pains garage.
