Dear Gary,

Your letter of 11/20, postmarked 11/21, arrived today. I'll try and get to it later today. It is entirely reasonable.

What I earlier indicated I would be sending is enclosed. I intend no offense in reminding you I want no mention of this to anyone under any circumstances. You may not regard it as I do, as possibly the hottest thing yet. But I want to control its use, prevent its misuse, and it is doubtful whether I'll be able to get the book written before we have to use it in court. With the proper witnesses on the stand, it should put some in jail, and it is more than enough to blow everything up, if anything can. If you have time, you may want to reread the letters leading up to it.

In some ways the most amazing parts are their open violation of the executive order and their tacit admission they lie to me about such matters as these.

Whether this portends something else, whether it foresees a change in policy, or whether it is from accident, embarrassment or ignorance, I can not pretend to know. I do know I am grateful for it.

Until I hear from Saul, I'll not send him the copy I've made and put aside. I hope he doesn't resent this and my letter on Dave (to which he has not responded).
