Sen. Schweiker: Reopen JFK Quiz

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard S. Schweiker (R-Pa.) says he will ask the Senate Intelligence Committee to reopen the investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Schweiker will sponsor a resolution that would direct the committee to look into indications that the FBI and the CIA withheld information that might have changed the conclusion of the Warren Commission, an aide said yesterday.

In its current issue, U. S. News & World Report quotes Schweiker as saying, "Until a few months ago I was one who believed the Warren Commission's conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald had acted alone. But all these new developments have caused me to question some of the Commission assumptions . . . To me it's like a big, public boil that's going to burst," he reportedly said.
