I realize that you do not have access to the files of the new intelligence committee. I recall wondering at the time the appointments were announced why you were not one of the Members.

What could be helpful would be if you recall seeing this wretched stuff and if you do what you recall of the allegations.

At the mement I'm trying to obtain all of it. I can already pinpoint unspecified withholdings, not just some that are withheld to protect the privacy of others. If you recall what was given to your committee that could help by telling me more about that is being withheld. I could then request it.

In time I'll use my right to request correction.

This, of course, is one of the things the bureaucrate do not want. I think I gave you an illustration of an outrageous fabrication. I also think that if you did not know it to be false it would have influenced you adversely. I'm sure it had the same effect wherever it was used, especially on LBJ.

If you remember enything at all I'd appreciate knowing what it is.
