ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT KENNEDY. TAKEN INTO CUSTODY TODAY WAS
CLAY SHAW, RETIRED DIRECTOR OF AN INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTER IN
NEW ORLEANS. NO CHARGES WERE FILED IMMEDIATELY. BUT THE D-A,
JIM GARRISON, SAID SHAW WILL BE ACCUSED OF TAKING PART IN A
CONSPIRACY.

GARRISON TOLD NEWSMEN "THERE WILL BE MORE ARRESTS. I
WANT TO HEAR ABOUT THE CASE, AS I HAVE SAID BEFORE. THE ARRESTS
HAVE BEEN UP. IF YOU WANT TO GET AGAINST ME, YOU WILL LOSE".

THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY SAID SHAW WAS ARRESTED AFTER BEING
DETAINED SEVERAL HOURS WITH A LAWYER PRESENT. GARRISON
IS A FORMER FIDEL OF \$47,000.

AN EVIDENCE, THE HOME OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD, MRS.
MARGARET OSWALD, SAID THE ARREST OF SHAW WAS--IN HER WORDS--
"THE BEST NEWS I'VE HEARD FOR A LONG TIME". SHE SENT A TELEGRAM
TO GARRISON AND SAID "HARD WORK AND EFFORT WILL SOLVE
THE PROBLEM."

THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY GAVE HIS DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE TODAY,
HE WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY BY THE D-A'S OFFICE. HE WAS TAKEN
TO THE D-A'S OFFICE TO ANSWER TO A SUBPOENA. HE
SAID HE HAD NEVER KNOWN OR HEARD OF OSWALD PRESSING

HE WAS A MAJOR IN WORLD WAR TWO AND WON

1947 UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT IN OCTOBER OF 1965. WHEN
HE WAS AWARDED HIM BY PRESENTING HIM A MEDAL.
HE IS LEADER OF A PRIVATELY-SUPPORTED ORGANIZATION
(THE TRADE THROUGH THE PORT OF NEW ORLEANS.)

NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 1 (AP)-DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON ARRESTED WEALTHY CLAY-L. SHAW TONIGHT AND ACCUSED HIM OF TAKING PART IN A CONSPIRACY TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

SHAW, A RETIRED EXECUTIVE, WAS BOOKED ON "CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT MURDER" AND RELEASED ON \$10,000 BOND.

"THERE WILL BE MORE ARRESTS," THE 6-FOOT-6 NEW ORLEANS DISTRICT ATTORNEY TOLD NEWSMEN. "I HAVE NO DOUBT ABOUT THE CASE. IF YOU WANT TO BET AGAINST ME, YOU WILL LOSE."

SHAW, 54, IS THE RETIRED MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE NEW ORLEANS INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART. HE WAS A DECORATED ARMY MAJOR IN WORLD WAR II.

A RUGGEDLY HANDSOME, SILVER-HAIRED MAN, SHAW WAS RELEASED AFTER BEING FINGERPRINTED AND MUGGED. HE REFUSED TO TALK TO NEWSMEN.

GARRISON'S AGENTS, ARMED WITH A SEARCH WARRANT, WENT OVER SHAW'S LUXURIOUS FRENCH QUARTER HOME FOR SEVERAL HOURS.

SHAW'S ARREST WAS ANNOUNCED BY GARRISON'S CHIEF INVESTIGATOR, WILLIAM GUEVICH. AT A TUMULTUOUS NEWS CONFERENCE IN THE ECHOING MARBLE CORRIDOR OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, HE READ THIS STATEMENT:

"THE FIRST ARREST HAS BEEN MADE IN THE INVESTIGATION OF THE NEW ORLEANS DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE INTO THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

"ARRESTED THIS EVENING IN THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WAS CLAY SHAW, AGE 54, OF 1313 DAUPHINE ST., NEW ORLEANS, LA.

"MR. SHAW WILL BE CHARGED WITH PARTICIPATION IN A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER JOHN F. KENNEDY.

"IT SHOULD BE POINTED OUT, HOWEVER, THAT THE NATURE OF THIS CASE IS NOT CONDUCTIVE TO AN IMMEDIATE SUCCESSION OF ARRESTS AT THIS TIME. HOWEVER, OTHER ARRESTS WILL BE MADE AT A LATER DATE."

SHAW WAS SUBPOENAED TODAY TO APPEAR AT GARRISON'S OFFICE. HE ARRIVED, STRIDING ERECT AND WELL DRESSED THROUGH THE RECEPTION ROOM, AT 12:15. HIS ARREST WAS ANNOUNCED AT 5:45.

ABOUT 2 1/2 HOURS AFTER THE ANNOUNCEMENT, SHAW, WEARING HANDCUTFS, ~~THEY~~ HOWEVER, OTHER ARRESTS WILL BE MADE AT A LATER DATE."

WAS BROUGHT OUT AND DRIVEN TWO BLOCKS FROM THE COURTHOUSE TO THE CENTRAL LOCKUP FOR PROCESSING.

SHAW, WHO STANDS ABOUT 6-2 AND WEIGHS 200, SMILED BRIEFLY THROUGH THE GLARE OF CAMERA LIGHTS. HE WAS FLANKED ON BOTH SIDES BY GARRISON'S MEN.

AT CENTRAL LOCKUP, SHAW WAS BOOKED AND DIST. JUDGE THOMAS M. BRAHNEY SET BOND. GARRISON HAD ASKED A BOND OF \$25,000 BUT THE JUDGE CALLED THAT AMOUNT "EXCESSIVE."

TECHNICALLY, UNDER LOUISIANA LAW, BEING BOOKED DOES NOT MEAN BEING FORMALLY CHARGED.

GURVICH SAID SHAW "WILL BE CHARGED WITH PARTICIPATING IN A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER JOHN F. KENNEDY"--BUT THAT HE COULDN'T SAY WHEN THE FORMAL CHARGE WILL BE FILED.

"SPECIAL CASES TAKE SPECIAL HANDLING," HE SAID.

IT WAS THE FIRST ARREST IN GARRISON'S 5-MONTH-OLD INVESTIGATION. HE HAS VOWED HE WILL PROVE THAT A CONSPIRACY BORN IN NEW ORLEANS "CULMINATED IN THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY" IN DALLAS NOV. 22, 1963.

THE INVESTIGATION, BACKING THE BELIEF OF MANY THAT A PLOT WAS INVOLVED IN THE SHOOTING, AROUSED INTERNATIONAL INTEREST.

GARRISON'S CLAIM OF CONSPIRACY IS IN DIRECT OPPOSITION TO THE OFFICIAL REPORT OF THE WARREN COMMISSION.

THE COMMISSION SAID LEE HARVEY OSWALD, A FORMER NEW ORLEANS RESIDENT, FIRED THE BULLETS THAT KILLED THE PRESIDENT AND WOUNDED TEXAS GOV. JOHN CONNALLY--AND THAT THERE WAS NO CREDIBLE EVIDENCE THAT ANY ONE ELSE WAS INVOLVED.

THE WARREN REPORT CONTAINED NO MENTION OF CLAY SHAW.

NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 1 (AP)-THE RETIRED DIRECTOR OF THE NEW ORLEANS INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART, CLAY SHAW, WAS ARRESTED BY DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON TODAY AND ACCUSED OF TAKING PART "IN A CONSPIRACY TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY."

NO IMMEDIATE CHARGE WAS FILED.

"THERE WILL BE MORE ARRESTS," THE 6-FOOT-6 DISTRICT ATTORNEY TOLD NEWSMEN. "I HAVE NO DOUBT ABOUT THE CASE, AS I HAVE SAID BEFORE. THE ARRESTS WILL HOLD UP. IF YOU WANT TO BET AGAINST ME, YOU WILL LOSE."

GARRISON SAID SHAW, 54, AN ARMY MAJOR DURING WORLD WAR II, HAD NOT MADE A STATEMENT. HE SAID SHAW HAD BEEN QUESTIONED PREVIOUSLY. *Garrison recommends;*
BOND OF \$25,000 ~~WAS SET~~

ABOUT TWO AND A HALF HOURS AFTER THE ARREST WAS ANNOUNCED, SHAW WAS BROUGHT OUT, HANDCUFFED, AND TAKEN TO CENTRAL LOCKUP. HE SMILED THROUGH THE GLARE OF CAMERA LIGHTS. DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S MEN FLANKED HIM ON BOTH SIDES.

DIST. JUDGE THOMAS M. BRAHNEY SET BOND AT \$10,000, WHICH WAS POSTED. BRAHNEY SAID HE FELT THAT GARRISON'S RECOMMENDATION OF \$25,000 BOND WAS EXCESSIVE.

SHAW WAS BOOKED -- BUT NOT FORMALLY CHARGED -- WITH "CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT MURDER." IN LOUISIANA, A CHARGE IS NOT FORMAL UNTIL IT HAS BEEN ACCEPTED BY A DISTRICT ATTORNEY.

A LAWYER FOR SHAW, EDWARD F. WEGMANN, SAID: "WE WILL HAVE A STATEMENT--BUT NOT TONIGHT."

WILLIAM GURVICH, CHIEF INVESTIGATOR, SAID SHAW "WILL BE CHARGED WITH PARTICIPATING IN A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER JOHN F. KENNEDY"--BUT HE COULDN'T SAY WHEN THE FORMAL CHARGE WOULD BE FILED.

NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 1 (AP)—DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON TODAY ARRESTED CLAY SHAW, 54, ONE-TIME ARMY MAJOR AND RETIRED DIRECTOR OF THE NEW ORLEANS INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART, AND ACCUSED HIM OF TAKING PART "IN A CONSPIRACY TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY."

NO IMMEDIATE CHARGE WAS PLACED. WILLIAM GURVICH, THE NEW ORLEANS DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S CHIEF INVESTIGATOR, SAID SHAW "WILL BE CHARGED WITH PARTICIPATING IN A CONSPIRACY TO MURDER JOHN F. KENNEDY"—BUT HE COULDN'T SAY WHEN THE CHARGE WOULD BE FILED.

"SPECIAL CASES TAKE SPECIAL HANDLING," SAID GURVICH AT A TUMULTUOUS NEWS CONFERENCE IN THE ECHOING MARBLE CORRIDOR OUTSIDE GARRISON'S OFFICES. "FOR ALL I KNOW IT COULD BE SEVERAL DAYS."

SHAW, A HANDSOME WELL-DRESSED SIX-FOOTER WITH SILVER HAIR, WAS SUBPOENAED TO APPEAR AT THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE. HE ARRIVED AT 12:15 P.M. THE ARREST WAS ANNOUNCED AT 5:45.

IT WAS THE FIRST ARREST IN GARRISON'S 5-MONTH-OLD INVESTIGATION, WHICH HE SAID WILL PROVE THAT A CONSPIRACY BORN HERE "CULMINATED IN THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY" IN DALLAS NOV. 22, 1963.

GARRISON'S PROBE AROUSED INTERNATIONAL INTEREST.

HIS CLAIM OF CONSPIRACY GOES COUNTER TO THE WARREN COMMISSION'S OFFICIAL REPORT THAT LEE HARVEY OSWALD FIRED THE BULLETS THAT KILLED KENNEDY AND WOUNDED TEXAS GOV. JOHN CONNELLY--AND THAT THERE WAS NO CREDIBLE EVIDENCE ANY ONE ELSE WAS INVOLVED.

THE WARREN REPORT CONTAINED NO MENTION OF CLAY SHAW.

IN ANNOUNCING GARRISON'S LATEST MOVE, GURVICH READ A BRIEF STATEMENT TO NEWSMEN:

"THE FIRST ARREST HAS BEEN MADE IN THE INVESTIGATION OF THE NEW ORLEANS DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE INTO THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY," HE SAID:

"ARRESTED THIS EVENING IN THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE WAS CLAY SHAW, AGE 54, OF 1313 DAUPHINE ST., NEW ORLEANS, LA.

SHAW LIVES ON DAUPHINE ST. IN THE FRENCH QUARTER, A LIVELY TOURIST
STAMPING GROUND HERE. FOR 18 YEARS HE WAS MANAGING DIRECTOR OF
NEW ORLEAN'S INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART.

THE MART IS A PRIVATELY-SUPPORTED, NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION FORMED
TO PROMOTE TRADE THROUGH THE PORT OF NEW ORLEANS.

SHAW RETIRED OCT. 1, 1965, SAYING THAT A NEW TRADE MART BUILDING
ERECTED AT THE FOOT OF CANAL ST., ON THE BANK OF THE MISSISSIPPI
RIVER, WAS THE FULFILLMENT OF HIS LIFELONG DREAM.

RETIREMENT, HE SAID, WOULD GIVE HIM TIME TO PURSUE HIS PERSONAL
INTERESTS AND MANAGE HIS REAL ESTATE HOLDINGS.

AT A CEREMONY MARKING HIS RETIREMENT, SHAW WAS PRESENTED A
PLAQUE AND THE INTERNATIONAL ORDER OF MERIT OF THE CITY OF NEW
ORLEANS MEDAL.

DURING WORLD WAR II HE WAS AWARDED THE FRENCH CROIX DE GUERRE
AND THE UNITED STATES LEGION OF MERIT AND BRONZE STAR. HE ALSO IS
A CHEVALIER OF THE ORDER OF THE CROWN OF BELGIUM AND, WHILE HE WAS
DIRECTOR OF THE TRADE MART, FRANCE GAVE HIM THE DISTINCTION OF
"CHEVALIER DE L'ORDRE DU MERITE COMMERCIAL."

BEFORE RETURNING TO NEW ORLEANS IN 1947, SHAW WAS BRIEFLY ENGAGED IN ADVERTISING AND PUBLIC RELATIONS WORK IN NEW YORK CITY.

A NATIVE OF KENTWOOD, LA., HE MOVED TO NEW ORLEANS WITH HIS FAMILY AT THE AGE OF FIVE.

OSWALD, A FORMER NEW ORLEANS RESIDENT, SHOWED UP ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS IN FRONT OF THE OLD TRADE MART BUILDING--NOW AN OFFICE BUILDING--TO HANDOUT PROPAGANDA LEAFLETS.

AT THE TIME, THE SUMMER OF 1963, OSWALD WAS WORKING WITH A GROUP HE CALLED "FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA," A PRO-CASTRO ORGANIZATION.

IN AN INTERVIEW LAST WEEK, SAHW SAID HE ONCE SAW OSWALD DISTRIBUTING THE LEAFLETS BUT NEVER MET OR SPOKE TO HIM.

GARRISON SAID HE WOULD FILE A BILL OF INFORMATION AGAINST SHAW.

UNDER LOUISIANA LAW, A DISTRICT ATTORNEY CAN BRING A PRISONER TO TRIAL UNDER ONE OF TWO METHODS: A GRAND JURY INDICTMENT OR BY FILING A BILL OF INFORMATION WITH A JUDGE.

EARLIER TODAY, AN EX-AIR FORCE PILOT UNDERWENT QUESTIONING IN GARRISON'S OFFICE AFTER BEING SUBPOENAED.

NEW ORLEANS, MARCH 1 (AP)--DIST. ATTY. JIM GARRISON'S INVESTIGATORS QUESTIONED A FORMER MANAGING DIRECTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL TRADE MART HERE AND AN EX-AIR FORCE PILOT TODAY AS THEY PUSHED AHEAD WITH THEIR KENNEDY ASSASSINATION PROBE.

CLAY SHAW, WHO RETIRED 18 MONTHS AGO FROM THE TRADE MART POST, REFUSED TO TALK WITH NEWSMEN WHEN HE REPORTED TO GARRISON'S OFFICE IN RESPONSE TO A SUBPOENA.

JAMES R. LEWALLEN, 38, AN EMPLOYEE OF THE BOEING CO., ALSO UNDERWENT QUESTIONING AFTER BEING SUBPOENAED. A BATON ROUGE SALESMAN, PERRY-RAYMOND-RUSSO, 25, APPEARED VOLUNTARILY TO PASS ON INFORMATION HE CLAIMS TO HAVE ABOUT THE ASSASSINATION.

GARRISON APPEARED BRIEFLY OUTSIDE HIS OFFICE AND SAID HIS INVESTIGATION WAS MOVING ON SCHEDULE. "THERE WON'T BE ANY PROBLEMS."

THE TALL DISTRICT ATTORNEY CREATED A WORLDWIDE SENSATION LAST WEEK WHEN HE SAID HE WOULD PROVE PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY WAS KILLED NOV. 22, 1963, IN DALLAS AS THE CULMINATION OF A CONSPIRACY STARTED IN NEW ORLEANS. HE PROMISED ARRESTS AND CONVICTIONS.

Kennedy Plot

New Orleans Businessman Is Accused

New Orleans

The retired director of the New Orleans International Trade Mart, Clay Shaw, was arrested by District Attorney Jim Garrison yesterday and accused of taking part "in a conspiracy to assassinate President John F. Kennedy."

No immediate charge was filed.

"There will be more arrests," the 6 foot, 6 inch district attorney told newsmen. "I have no doubt about the case, as I have said before. The arrests will hold up. If you want to bet against me, you will lose."

BAIL

Garrison said Shaw, 54, an Army major during World War II, had not made a statement. He said Shaw had been questioned previously. Garrison recommended bond of \$25,000.

William Gurvich, chief investigator, said Shaw "will be charged with participating in a conspiracy to murder John F. Kennedy" — but he couldn't say when the formal charge would be filed.

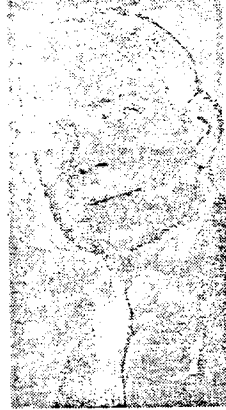
It was announced that Shaw would remain in jail overnight.

"Special cases take special handling," said Gurvich at a tumultuous news conference in the echoing marble corridor outside Garrison's offices. "For all I know it would be several days."

ARREST

Shaw, a handsome well-dressed six-footer with silver hair, was subpoenaed to appear at the district attorney's office. He arrived at 12:15 p.m. and was placed under arrest five and a half hours later.

It was the first arrest in Garrison's 5-month-old investigation, which he said will

prive that a conspiracy born in New Orleans "culminated in the assassination of President Kennedy" in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963.

Garrison's probe has aroused international interest. His claim of conspiracy goes counter to the Warren Commission's official report that Lee Harvey Oswald fired the bullets that killed Kennedy and wounded Texas Governor John Connally — and that there was no credible evidence any one else was involved.

STATEMENT

In announcing Garrison's latest move, Gurvich read a brief statement to newsmen:

"The first arrest has been made in the investigation of the New Orleans District Attorney's office into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy," he said.

"It should be pointed out," he added, "that the nature of this case is not conducive to an immediate succession of arrests at this time. However, other arrests will be made at a later date."

Shaw's name apparently does not appear in the summary of the Warren Commission's report. He is not listed as a witness.

Garrison said Shaw had a lawyer with him during the long afternoon of interrogation. He said Shaw would be booked on the authority of the District Attorney.

Shaw was subpoenaed to appear at the District Attorney's office in the morning. On arrival, he walked quickly through the reception room, past newsmen, saying he was "not speaking to anyone."

Shaw lives on Dauphine street in the French Quarter, a tourist stamping ground here. For 13 years he was managing director of New Orleans International Trade Mart.

TRADE

The mart is a privately supported, non-profit organization formed to promote trade through the port of New Orleans. Shaw retired Oct. 1, 1965.

At a ceremony marking his retirement, Shaw was presented a plaque and the International Order of Merit of the city of New Orleans medal.

During World War II he was awarded the French Croix de Guerre and the United States Legion of Merit and Bronze Star. He also is a chevalier of the Order of the Crown of Belgium and, while he was director of the Trade Mart, France gave him the distinction of "Chevalier de L'Ordre du Merite Commercial."

LEAFLETS

Oswald, a former New Orleans resident, showed up on several occasions in front of the old Trade Mart Building — now an office building — hand out propaganda leaflets.

At the time, the summer of 1963, Oswald was working with a group he called "Fair Play for Cuba," a pro-Castro organization.

In an interview last week, Shaw said he once saw Oswald distributing the leaflets but never met or spoke to him.

Earlier yesterday, an ex-air force pilot underwent questioning in Garrison's office after being subpoenaed. He was not held.

QUESTIONS

James R. Lewallen, 38, an employee of the Boeing Co., also underwent questioning after being subpoenaed. A Baton Rouge salesman, Perry Raymond Buss, 25, appeared voluntarily to pass on information he claims to have about the assassination.
