An attorney for Clay L. Shaw who asked Criminal District Attorney F. Irvin Dymond Tuesday requested subpenas for a list of persons including the district attorney, members of his legal and investigative staff, seven of the eight judges of Criminal District Court, and the foreman and all members

for a Monday hearing hinted strong, whose name appears in one of Shaw's son had Shaw arrested on March 1 and booked with participating in a conspiracy to murder President John F. Kennedy. His of fice later requested a prelim inary hearing in which three Criminal District Court judges or ordered Shaw held over for trial. Still later, the grand jury indicted Shaw on the conspiracy charge.

Subpenas were also requested for three prominent members of an organization that in part has been financing Garrison's investigation into the Kennedy assassination.

Absent from the list, however, was Odom, who has said he gave Shaw his Dallas post of-fice box number in 1965.

Dymond would not say definitely whether Odom will be present for Monday's hearing.

"If we want him we're going to have him here," Dymond said.

A motion for the return of seized property by Shaw's attorneys is one of the issues to be argued Monday in the sec-tion of court of Judge Edward A. Haggerty Jr. Five boxes of material were carted off by Garrison's men from Shaw's apartment the day of his arrest

Garrison several weeks ago filed an answer to Shaw's motion in which he attempted to link Shaw, accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, and Jack Ruby, who killed Os-wald and died months later of cancer.

Garrison said he had found identical post office box num-bers in Shaw's address book and that when properly decoded, they yield Ruby's 1963 private telephone number in Dal-
