Dear Mom,

An adverse weather forecast, snow and sleet, together with the cold - it has not yet warmed up to freezing - impels me to leave earlier than I would to get this in the mail. After I return I will finish on the prospective witnesses. I am somewhat handicapped by not knowing your doctrine, what you want to show, with what overtones.
