Dr. Debs followed the crisis-ridden one-year tenure of Dr. Harold Delaney, who was drafted from the board of trustees after the departure of Elizabeth J. McCormack, a former Sacred Heart nun. Dr. Debs, who will continue to teach art history, is married to Richard A. Debs, the No. 2 executive of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York.

Tufts University announced the appointment of Denise Levartov yesterday as a professor of English. The poet and former poetry editor of The Nation magazine has been a visiting professor at the Medford, Mass., school for two years.

Eunice Kennedy Shriver joined the Kennedy family members on record against reinvestigation of her brothers' assassinations, saying yesterday that "trying to trace whether there is a conspiracy" is part of the nation's preoccupation with violence. The wife of Sargent Shriver, a candidate for the Democratic Presidential nomination, told The Christian Science Monitor that she was satisfied with the Warren Commission conclusions. Public "attention and energy," she said, could better be directed at "solving why people aren't employed or how the heck to get jobs for teenagers."
