This second letter comes to you, because I want to continue a line of thinking; other thoughts crowd my mind at the moment.

According to Pat Michaels KGO-TV, he did a minor investigation of the death of Senator Robert F. Kennedy. He considers the source reliable and trustworthy. The woman, whom he missed unidentified, worked on the 11th floor of the Ambassador hotel the night of the murder and was secretary for the Crenshaw headquarters. There was a party going on that night. She claims "Two men" entered the dance area ~~at~~ seconds after the shots were fired and tried to blend with the crowd. They seemed nervous and agitated, and looked suspicious. I have written to Michaels and received no answer from him. But he did mention all this on T.V., on his show, Channel 2, Oakland.

I have found an article entitled "Assignment - Kill ROBERT Kennedy" by NORMAN VINCE, in SEPT 1964 issue of the magazine, in which a Union bugle band officer named Jimmy Hoffa wanted Robert Kennedy dead and mentioned a "high powered" rifle which he would use to carry out the murder against Hoffa, according to the article.
