Prison 'Revolution'

SACRAMENTO — California's prison system is "under revolutionary attack," according to an offi-

cial state report prepared for Gov. Ronald Reagan.

The study on violence in California prisons, prepared by the State Board of Corrections, charges "militant inmates supported by some irresponsible attorneys are the prime causes of violence in California prisons."

James Hall, chairman of the board and Reagan's Secretary of Human Relations, said he believes the attack "is being encouraged by some members of organizations such as the National Lawyers Guild, the underground press, and other misguided individuals."

Hall said he "has no doubt that California's prison system is under revolutionary attack from within and outside state prison walls."

The report issued late Friday says the wave of violence in prison was "triggered" by the January 1970 killing of three black inmates by a Soledad prison tower guard.
