On 6/7/65, MIKHAIL STEPAN SOLOVIEV, Translator, Institute of Modern Languages, Incorporated, 1322 18th Street, N. Y., advised SA W. SCOTT JARRETT, JR. that during 1946-47 while a displaced person at Saltzbarg, Austria, he was the editor of an anti-communist publication called the Flame. SCHOVERY recalled that during this time subject was on the staff of this publication and contributed enti-communist articles designed to discourage displaced persons from returning to Russia. SOLOVIEV commented that the Riecians in the Soviet Sector made strong protests to the Americans regarding these publications.

SOLOVIEV atated that in about 1948 subject immigrated SOLOVIEV did not know subject prior to 1946-47 and knows nothing of his background prior to this time. SOLOVIEV subsequently insulgrated to the U. S. and did not hear of or from subject until about two years ago when he corresponded with the subject. Diring this correspondence subject asked his if he would recommend that subject come to the U. S. SOLOVIEV told him it would not be easy but that he would find a place.

SOLOVIEV stated that after immigration to U. S. and while subject was at the University of Maryland, about two years ago, he had occasion to met and talk with subject. At this time arbject stated he had been associated with the University of Chile in research work as a Professor of Physics. PEOLOVIEV also understood that subject did research work for the Government of Brazil and would spend three of four wonths year in Brazil on this research.
