Dear Mr. Specter:

As you may recall, I addressed a question to you yesterday at the "Lunch Rap" held at the University of Pennsylvania. My question concerned your work on the Warren Commission, a topic which we have discussed before.

Much against my own wishes, events took a course which might possibly have caused you some chagrin. Please understand that it is not in any way my intention to embarrass or persecute you. When I ask serious questions, I do so only to receive serious response.

You pointed out yesterday that I had previously asked you my question and that you had already answered it. It is my recollection that while I had once before posed that question, you did not respond to it. It addresses a serious conflict in the record you have left and I desired an explanation. I therefore did not consider it improper to pose the question once more, and felt this would likewise give you the opportunity to correct the record in public.

Again, please be assured that I pose my questions strictly in the interests of ascertaining the truth, never to harass or embarrass.
