

Attorney backs Warren findings

PHILADELPHIA (UPI) — Dist. Atty. Arlen Specter, who served as an assistant counsel to the Warren commission, said yesterday nothing would be uncovered by another investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Specter said it would be up to history to answer author William Manchester's charge in his book "The Death of a President" that Lee Harvey Oswald's Russian-born wife, Marina, was questioned too leniently by the Warren commission.

Specter said she was after all a wife testifying about her husband, and cited the problem of her speaking through an interpreter. (UPI 2-7-67)
