Something that has long been on my mind and I once at least mentioned to you and I think Bud seems to me to be fortified by yesterday's arguments in the Kent State case before the Supreme Court. In the Post's story (A3) today it is the part in the last column referring to Geltner's argument. I think I can and should sue Williams and the various lawyers in any way involved in his affidavit and its use and the Department for denying me my rights. If the approach, while novel, seems a possibility to you, then I think you know those with whom I think you should discuss it. There may be a question about whether or not it was perjury and subornation, but in no case is there doubt about the various intents and effects. Please recall that in all the suits there was lying if not perjury, and I see no reason not to include those. HW 12/5/73
