Computer Man Claims Plot Killed JFK

NEWTON, Mass. (UPI)—A computer specialist Friday published the results of a computerized analysis of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy which he said indicated four gunmen firing from different locations committed the crime.

Writing in the May issue of "Computers and Automation," Richard E. Sprague said his analysis of the evidence indicated the assassination was the result of a conspiracy involving over 50 persons.

Sprague's article also said that members of the Dallas police department and elements of the CIA were involved in the plot.

300 Photographs

Sprague based his conclusions on a partially completed computerized analysis of over 300 photographs and 25,000 frames of movie sequences.

He said that of the 500 photographs available to the Warren Commission, it only looked at 26.

Sprague, president of Personal Data Service, Hartsdale, N.Y., said the Warren Commission conclusion that Lee Harvey Oswald was the sole assassin was false.
