If I'd had those "Tramp" pictures I'd have been able to enclose xeroxes to make it clear that the men were not handcuffed and the officers had their pistols holstered. *and the time from the shadows.*

I would appreciate it you would please return those things I've asked you not to use. All you have to do is address an envelope and enclose them, and that takes little time. I hate to keep after you about this and I hate the delay for which there seems to be no need or reason.

If in the FOIA records I gave you there is the FBI Dallas report on those "tramp" pictures I triggered when they were misused in the King assassination, I'd appreciate a copy. I can't locate the copy - had and searching <sup>the sections</sup> for it is beyond me now.

To help you identify it, they interviewed two cops, one Bass in the ID division, and a deputy, and they, mistakenly, put the <sup>boxcar</sup> ~~train~~ about a mile away,
