"Bugsy," starring Warren Beatty in the film biography of mobster Bugsy Siegel, was the big winner in yesterday's Golden Globe Awards nominations, receiving eight, including ones for best picture (drama), best director, best actor (drama), best actress (drama) and best screenplay. The awards, which are given by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, offer a glimpse of what the Oscars may have in store. "Bugsy" was followed by "The Fisher King," and "The Silence of the Lambs," which each received five nominations, while Disney's latest full-length animated feature, "Beauty and the Beast," Oliver Stone's "JFK" and the buddy movie "Thelma & Louise" were each nominated four times. "The Prince of Tides," Barbra Streisand's adaptation of Pat Conroy's novel, was nominated for best dramatic film and Streisand received a nomination for best director, but she was not nominated for her acting. The winners will be announced Jan. 18.
