New 'JFK' special coming

Another syndicated program on the assassination of President Kennedy is being readied by All American Communications, the company that recently did the twohour live event special "The JFK Conspiracy."

The All American special "The Kennedy Assassinations: Conspiracy or Coincidence" is scheduled for broadcast July 7.

The assassination has been revisited at a galloping pace by the syndicated tabloid shows in recent months, including Twentieth Television's "A Current Affair" and Tribune's "Now It Can Be Told."

The previous All American live event on the assassination April 15 delivered a 7.3 rating nationally, according to A.C. Nielsen data, making it the ninth-ranked syndicated show that week.

"Numerous new witnesses have come forth bearing additional information linking the assassinations of John F. Kennedy and Robert F. Kennedy," said All American senior executive vp Paul Siegel.

Sapp's story to be NBC film

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (AP) — Miss America Carolyn Sapp will star in a TV movie about an abusive relationship with a former boyfriend, NBC announced.

"Miss America: Behind the Crown" is scheduled to air in September, the network said.

Sapp, 25, claimed she was abused by Nuu Faaola, a former running back for the New York Jets, while the couple lived in her home state of Hawaii.

In 1990, Sapp filed an affidavit in a Honolulu court claiming that Faaola beat her and threatened her with a knife.
