'JFK' doesn't intrigue Bush

President Bush said he hasn't seen Oliver Stone's movie "JFK," but he also "has seen no evidence" to doubt the Warren Commission's finding that Lee Harvey Oswald was a solo act in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

The film indicates that the shooting was a massive conspiracy involving top political and military figures plus mob types.

In a news conference Thursday in Canberra, Australia, Bush said that when he piloted the Central Intelligence Agency in the mid-1970s he made no attempt to examine the assassination files.

"I didn't have any curiosity," the president said. "Still see no reason to question (the Warren Commission Report). . . . There's all kinds of conspiratorial theories floating around on everything. Elvis Presley is rumored to be alive and well someplace. . . ."
