

'Cradle' rocks as B.O. biz on record pace

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period adventure pic "The Silk Road," unrolling smoothly in one Gotham field.

"Cradle" rocked upward 1% to a chilling \$8,120,455, or \$4,617 per in 1,759 nurseries (entering 37), while running its 24-day take to a torrid \$42,852,585.

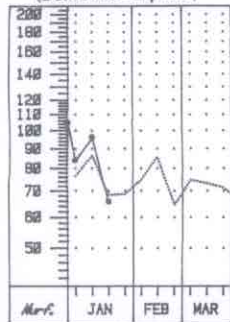
"Fried Green Tomatoes" remained in second as it added 375 griddles and jumped 27% to a delicious \$6,675,765 in its sixth home-cookin'. Averaging a whopping \$6,370 in 1,048 eateries, the pic advanced its 38-day B.O. to a nifty \$16,816,819.

"Shining Through" averaged a bright \$4,474 in 1,432 pubs en route to its feisty \$6,406,829 opening intrigue.

BV's "Father of the Bride" slipped from third to fourth in its seventh toast but was up 1% dollar-

wise to a cheery \$3,820,796. Averaging \$2,255 in 1,694 tuxedo rental shops (leaving 18), the matrimonial comedy saw its 45-day cumulative climb to a pleasant \$68,748,711.

Fox's L.A. angst drama "Grand Canyon" added 179 screens and was off 1% as it went from fourth to fifth in its sixth musing, hauling in a strong \$3,628,290. With \$2,967 per in 1,223 neighborhoods, the pic upped its 40-day take to a steady \$20,534,475.

High-gross 'Beauty'

BV's "Beauty and the Beast"—which last Thursday became the first fully animated film to pass the \$100 million domestic gross mark in its initial release (*Daily Variety*, Jan. 30)—remains a remarkably powerful post-holidays holdover.

Rising from eighth to sixth in its 12th waltz, the fairy-tale tuner sang in a mellow \$3,276,760 (up 1%), or \$1,988 per in 1,648 ballrooms (exiting 115). The 82-day total is now \$103,446,010.

TriStar's "Hook" lost 201 screens and dropped from fifth to seventh while giving up a modest 8% in its eighth outlass-brandishing to a still-sprightly \$3,231,360. Averaging \$1,760 in 1,836 galleons, the fantasy-adventure ran its 35-day take to a hearty \$107,260,204.

Warner Bros.' "JFK" was down a slender 9% in its seventh inquiry to a solid \$3,185,727 while slipping from sixth to eighth. Doing \$2,284 per in 1,395 courtrooms (entering 25), the 189-minute assassination docudrama now has a terrific \$34,682,068 after 45 days.

Columbia's romantic drama "The Prince of Tides," off a picaresque 12% in its sixth session to a probing \$3,024,206, fell from seventh to ninth on an average of \$1,956 on 1,546 couches (arriving in one). The 40-day take is a fine

\$56,480,546. Rounding out the top 10 and remaining in position was Paramount's "Juice," which followed its precipitous (67%) collapse of a weekend earlier with a more temperate (20%) dropoff.

Averaging a paltry \$1,997 on 1,079 streetcorners (leaving 21) during its third frame, the urban youth drama pic did a quiet \$2,154,600 and ran its 17-day take to a disappointing \$14,762,545.

Farther down the list, newcomer "Into the Sun" was no "Top Gun"

as it barely flew with \$1,222 per in 288 hangars for a blah weekend total of \$352,064.

"Hard Promises" didn't pick much cotton, baling only \$1,286 per in 142 fields during its \$182,574 opening labor.

The American indie pic "Alan & Naomi" averaged only \$1,632 per in 52 boroughs during its uneventful \$84,855 first encounter.

"The Silk Road," a lavish Japanese-Chinese production, counted a satisfactory \$11,327 on one N.Y. abacus during its U.S. debut.
