Stone raves about Congress

"JFK" director Oliver Stone said Wednesday during a visit to Washington that "Congress deserves an Oscar" for moving to release intelligence documents on the assassination of **President Kennedy**. Stone met with key lawmakers and administration officials to promote an opening of the assassination records. Stone met with Sen. **David Boren**, D-Okla., chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, who assured Stone in the closed-door session that he sees no obstacles to the release of tens of thousands of CIA, FBI and military documents relating to the 1963 assassination.
