Stone raves about Congress

"JFK" director Oliver Stone said Wednesday during a visit to Washington that "Congress deserves an Oscar" for moving to release intelligence documents on the assassination of President Kennedy. Stone met with key lawmakers and administration officials to promote an opening of the assassination records. Stone met with Sen. David Boren, D-Okla., chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee, who assured Stone in the closed-door session that he sees no obstacles to the release of tens of thousands of CIA, FBI and military documents relating to the 1963 assassination.
