I got the enclosed pamphlet of 40 years ago from a friend who had a book on the publisher, E. Haldeman-Julius. Among his multitudinous publications were very cheap condensations of various kinds of classics printed vest-pocket size and selling for a nickel. He took full-page ads in the large newspapers and sold them by mail for that. Postage then was 2¢ for a letter. He was heavy on the political, in the sense of traditional American belief. I remember that the first of the poems by the Sullivan who was Gilbert's partner I got from him, if I recall correctly, in the small size and leather bindings. Many English classics were distributed here this way.
