Just a very brief note to explain what's in this envelope & a couple other things.

I dug out some more material on Professor Josiah Thompson, that included here.

The sheaf of things clipped together represents the most complete set I've gotten on PAS so far. It's transcripts of the interviews you were on that we sent, photo copies of the "invoices" we sent, and a photocopy of the check. You will notice that on the "invoices" there's a signature -- "Jeanne L. Baker," approving the invoice. This has never before happened. Mrs. Baker is the woman that our Washington office calls to check and see if they want a particular story or interview.

I also found an article on Sparrow, which you may have already seen, but I send it along anyhow.

I have a man working on the Vallee thing. He has access to all the Chicago Police & Department records. I don't want to use him too often, because he's ~~is~~ also in a rather precarious position vis-a-vis the Administration in Chicago, but he says he can get me the full information on the guy in a few weeks. It would be very helpful, though, if we had his first name. At any rate, this man felt that looking up something like that in Chicago was very hot and very dangerous. He didn't say why he thought so.

Personally things have been going very well for me, except that I've been busy as hell, that's why I haven't mailed this stuff before. I had an appearance before my local draft board last week, during which I spoke very honestly with them for an hour, and they asked me to file for conscientious objector status. I did that this week.

I got your order blanks yesterday, too late for the Student Mobilization thing, but I'll put them to good use anyway. I gave some (about 5) to ~~the~~ the sister of the young lady whose name I gave you on the phone when you were in New Orleans. She goes to school at Florida State College, was very interested, and said she'd start a campaign to get the campus book store to stock your books. Let's hope it works out. That's about all for now.
