He had sent long-time friend, Torby Macdonald to Saigon, <sup>as</sup> a personal emissary to warn Diem that his life was in danger and to seek assylum in the American embassy. Though Kennedy had ~~known~~ consented to Diem's removal and had apparently known of the generals' desire to execute him, clearly he had wished Diem's *life* to be spared.
