

JFM accompanying records appeals Harold Weisberg 8/21/79
The Garber letter; historical case standards
Anti-Castro training camps raids on Cuba

If all the withholdings on page 2 of 62-105060-4753 would ordinarily qualify for withholding under the 5/5/77 FOIA policy, which I doubt, I believe they and others do not in historical cases. The matter referred to on page 2 is public. I wrote about it in early 1967.

In varying degrees what is withheld following this is also public.

The subject matter is anti-Castro raids and a deposit of explosives in the home of the brother of a well-known gambling figure, near New Orleans, and related matters.

Related withholdings in 4760 also include entire paragraphs from which some information is reasonably segregable.

All 14 pages of what appears to be related, 4759, were referred to both the Army and CIA - two years ago.

I believe that 4758 was referred to DDCI LRR. (b)(7)(C) and (D) are claimed. Two pages are withheld in their entirety.

Serial 4789, which has related content, has two pages withheld in their entirety. I believe some is reasonably segregable. I believe this also of entire paragraphs that are withheld.
