FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE I HAVE ENCLOSED A SELF-ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE AND I DO HOPE THAT YOU CAN REPLY AT YOUR EARLIEST CONVENIENCE.

I HAVE ONLY THREE QUESTIONS TO ASK OF YOU AND ALL DEAL WITH PAGE 423 OF CHAPTER 33. THESE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) YOU STATED THAT MR. WARREN, WHILE WALKING THROUGH DEALEY PLAZA, TALKED TO "POLICE OFFICERS" AND "WITNESSES IN THE SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY BUILDING". HAVE YOU ANY INFORMATION AS TO PRECISELY WHO THESE POLICE OFFICERS AND WITNESSES WERE? WAS YOUR INFORMATION OBTAINED FROM AN INTERVIEW, MR. WARREN'S PERSONAL NOTES OR A PARTICULAR DOCUMENT?
- (2) WHERE DID YOU DETERMINE THE ESTIMATE OF "SLIGHTLY LESS THAN 8 SECONDS" (FOR THE ASSASSINATION)? IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THE WARREN REPORT STATED THAT 5.6 SECONDS WAS THE TOTAL TIME. WHAT SOURCE DID YOU DEPEND UPON FOR YOUR ESTIMATE?
- (3) MY FINAL QUERY RELATES TO THE FOOTNOTE AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE. WHERE DID YOU OBTAIN THE INFORMATION THAT WAR-REN BELIEVED THAT THE FIRST SHOT HIT BOTH KENNEDY AND CONN-ALLY? DID YOU ACQUIRE THIS FROM AN INTERVIEW, MR. WARREN'S PERSONAL NOTES OR A PARTICULAR DOCUMENT?

I DO HOPE THAT I HAVE NOT BURDENED YOU WITH MY QUERIES AND THAT YOU CAN REPLY TO THESE QUESTIONS.
