As you know, footage has a way of being edited and sometimes misunderstood and presented in a way other than intended.

Most of the film has nothing to do with the NBC involvement. I didn't went tot talk about that and did only on the insistence of your reporter. What does not relate to NBC but does to my book was considered newsworthy enough by the New York Times for a single news story to run 44 inches, rather unusual treatment for any book.

I regret the news judgement of local media, if that is what it is, is otherwise.

May I commend you on your judgement in not carrying the NBC New Orleans show. It is not something you would have been proud of when you learn the truth, which will not be long in becoming public.
