Dear Mr. Hegan,

Persuant to our just-completed phone conversation, I am writing to ask for those things you had earlier said you would send me, including a clear copy of the Skolnick suit, with attachments, copies of the press on the suit, particularly the AP A wire initial story, and dubs of your relevant tapes. For the reasons I presume are now quite clear to you, especially to the end that the damage might be held to the minimum now possible, I hope you will do this as rapidly as possible.

However, we live in the country and there is no point in wasting postage on "special delivery", for there is none in rural areas.

I had hoped that we might, from mutual interest, maintain an informal relationship, for I think that would have served both interests. Further, there is the probability of added damage, and I think that serves no legitimate interest.

There are other things you should have, things not made public, like notes, memoranda, unused tapes, etc. If your management or lawyers would permit me to have copies, this also could be helpful to all legitimate interests. And I think it also might make more possible the elimination or reduction of further hurt from this entire mess.
