WARREN COMMISSION FINDINGS TO BE RE-EXAMINED IN THREE-HOUR SPECIAL

SCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 12, FROM 8:00 - 11:00 P.M. BY WTTG

Channel Five Telecast Will Bring Five Leading Critics Of
Warren Report Together For The First Time

WTTG will present television's first full-scale exploration of the
Warren Commission Report in a special program to be seen from
8:00 - 11:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 12, on Channel 5.

During the three-hour news special, titled, "A Re-examination Of
The Warren Commission Findings: A Minority Report", five authors
of newsmaking books and articles confront each other for the first
time to argue various aspects of the Commission's findings, which
were issued in September, 1964.

Participants in the special telecast include:

Mark Lane -- Attorney and author of "Rush To Judgement". Mr. Lane
is a former New York Assemblyman who testified twice before the
Warren Commission and formed the Citizens Committee of Inquiry into
the facts surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy.
Leo Sauvage -- American correspondent for "Le Figaro" for nearly
20 years, he is the author of "The Oswald Affair, An Examination
of the Contradictions and Omissions of the Warren Report."

Harold Weisberg -- Author of "Whitewash, The Report on the Warren Report."

Penn Jones --- ~~Editor of the Midlothian (Texas) Mirror, and author~~
of "Forgive My Grief".

Jacob Cohen - - Author of "The Missing Documents", an article appearing in "The Nation" magazine. Mr. Cohen taught for three years at Yale; and five years at Brandeis University.

The moderator of the program will be Jim Bishop, nationally syndicated columnist and author of "The Day Lincoln Was Shot". Mr. Bishop is currently working on a new book called, "The Day Kennedy Was Shot".

David Schoenbrun, distinguished news analyst, will participate as host and will provide commentary on the discussion.
