The enclosed article from a small probably black Baltimore newspaper is for your information, not because I think it suggests a crime you can prosecute.

The basic facts have been known for years to those of us interested in the subject and familiar with the Commission's records.

What is new is that the doctors are willing to talk.

The situation has been unfair to them for years.

Possibly the irresponsibilities of the recent committee helped turn them on.

Years ago, when I talked to some of them, I felt they'd still be afraid so I limited myself to narrow areas and did not go into this, which I believed they'd have been unwilling to go into.

Drs. Perry and Carrico impressed me much, as decent people. Thereafter both left Dallas and went to the University of Washington. I hear Perry is now in New York.

Livingstone does not have the highest reputation. I don't know him but others consider ^{him} ~~me~~ from odd to paranoid.

It does not appear likely that he faked the Peters letter.
