Philadelphia, Nov. 24 (AP)- Dist. Atty. Arlen Specter, an investigator for the Warren Commission that probed President John F. Kennedy's assassination, says Texas Gov. John B. Connally is "just incorrect" in disputing the "single bullet" decision in the case.

Specter was instrumental in developing the decision that said the bullet which hit Kennedy in the back of the neck existed through his throat and hit Connally. Another bullet hit Kennedy in the head.

Connally said he believed the first shot and a third shot hit Kennedy while ~~he~~ was hit by the second one.

Specter, at a news conference yesterday, said that based on home movies the commission "found compelling evidence that a single bullet struck Kennedy in the neck and then struck Connally."

Specter said, however, he did not eliminate the possibility three bullets hit the men, but said, "in any event, the single-shot ~~xxx~~ assumption is well-founded."

Regarding proposals that the investigation be reopened, Specter said, "I would not express any disagreement with anyone who wanted to review the commission's work or reopen the investigation, but personally I don't think this would serve any useful purpose.

"There has been no new evidence and no sound inferences to change in any way the conclusions of logical deductions of the commission."

The commission found that Lee Harvey Oswald, acting alone, killed Kennedy, a ruling that has been disputed.
