

Non-fatal injuries not a neck wound:

Autopsy chart by Col. Finck, Exhibit 397 (my page 197)
(six inches below collar)

... Identified and certified by Dr. Humes (my page 183)

This in turn affirmed by ^{Dr.} Finck and Boswell (my page 165)

"...remained in my personal custody at all times"-
Humes (my page 183)

Official Secret Service observer at autopsy, Hill: "...six
inches down from the neckline (18H740-5; my 185)

Autopsy doctors on hole in coat, shirt, "six inches
below the top of the collar (2H365; my page 185)

Kellerman never in his testimony referred to a neck wound
and was never asked about a neck wound. The word
"shoulder" was used (my page 185)

Secret Service Agent Bennett saw the bullet strike in the
back (my page 185)

And even Dr. Humes at one point ~~xxx~~ testified that the
bullet hole in the coat and shirt "corresponds
essentially with the point of entrance" (2H365,
my page 185) had

FBI Report: "one of the (two) bullets entered just below
his shoulder" (my page 185)

The FBI report also said
its angle was not less than 45 degrees and
could have been as much as 60 degrees;
(Note that the Commission Report give an
angle of about 10 degrees - exhibit 385)
it had "no point of exit and...was not in
the body", hence could not

Have caused the governor's injuries
have caused the President's bullet
wound in the anterior neck

(Bearing on this is the burning of "certain
preliminary draft notes" of the autopsy
by Dr. Humes in his home (my pages 186,
183; 2H371), which he said was a rough
draft of the autopsy, and the existing
rough draft (exhibit 387, my page 198)
which clearly, in Humes' own hand-
writing reveals that the Dallas doctors
did describe the front wound as of entrance,
a fact visibly edited out of the autopsy)

(Ex. 399, my p. 208)

(Also bearing on this is the testimony of all three
autopsy doctors that the bullet could not
have caused all the non-fatal injuries to
both the President and the governor; m.p. 165,
and that of the Dallas doctors, my pp. 173-4,
misrepresented in the Report of the Commission.

Note that FBI Report does not account for either President's front neck
wound or "missed" or "curbstone" bullet, hence does account for two more,
or a minimum of five.
