Post Appoints Geyelin Editorial Page Editor

Philip L. Geyelin, for the past year a member of the editorial page staff of The Washington Post, was named yesterday as editor of the editorial page by Editor J. R. Wiggins, Vice President of The Washington Post Company.

Geyelin came to The Washington Post from the Wall Street Journal with which he was associated for nearly 20 years. He was the Journal's labor and White House reporter for several years, then its chief correspondent in Europe and later diplomatic correspondent in Washington.

During his foreign assignment, from 1956 to 1960, he covered the Suez crisis, the Lebanon landings and events in Berlin, Baghdad, Paris and London. He served in the U.S. Marine Corps from 1943 to 1946.

He was born at Devon, Pa., attended the Episcopal Academy at Overbrook, Pa. and graduated from Yale University.

He is the author of "Lyndon B. Johnson and the World," published by Frederick A. Praeger, Inc., in 1966.
