Dear Bob Woodward,

My call yesterday was merely to be sure the picture had not been lost in the mail. I have others of Durst, printed. And the memo occurs in my files in connection with traductions, besides what I told you. As I recall, one involves a bribe of \$240,000.

If you don't mind a suggestion, if the Executive Office Building, like most offices, including yours, keeps records of late-hour users or with a walkie-talkie in Martin's office, is it possible that there might be a record showing whether he was in his office, walkie-talkie equipped, at the time of the Watergate break?

Something has just come to me indicating the possibility that Martin may have been involved in some of my early literary problems. I'd prefer to go no further now for various reasons. It was a time when he was still working for the CIA and also had another connection, the one that did involve me. I have checked my files since finding this new evidence and there is no doubt of anything except the proof that Martin was directly involved in the killing of a deal. The book was not to CIA liking.

I'm surprised you couldn't get hold of Alberto Poulson. After all, why I thought I should have suggested to you adding at least one New Orleans reporter. I'm sure George Snyder, your stringer there, would know if Alberto is still town. There was a change of mayors, not parties. He may have been replaced. But he seemed like a New Orleans fixture. Mario Fernandez, who had the next office and also a second, fixture, would know, too. Radio 4's door also had the legend "Cordell Hull Foundation". I guess it has been a year since I heard of Alberto. I then showed you the name info.
