Dear Mr. Fortas.

Today's Pest's story, which I imagine is the cause of some unhappiness to you, carries as back to the Durr senerial, when you asked no to arrange to see you in your effice. It relates to one of the matters I suggested might be of interest to you.

With the passing of time we forget. Het leng after these services I was heepitalised with serious thrembephlebitis. You may have forgetten this or you may have decided not to interest yourself when I wrote you last April. Your file will show I did not push. I am not now.

Obviously I have no way of knowing what is behind this story. I see the atypical in it. I see it as a hatchet job. There are completely abserval emissions from what I know of fact and journalism. Two are Velfann's former Washington base and his first wife's terminal illness. The emission of this illness at the time he said he had to stay out of jail for a while longer strikes no as vengeful writing.

You had little recellection of how we not. Your wife probably did not know no well when I was a Senate inventigator and she was in our effices often. (She, my wife and Bort Wheeler's daughter Francis were the young wemen who then did what they could about Japanese aggression by scaring lists stockings.) Virginia Durr resumbers no well, if you want to learn about me from these you know.

In recent years I have deveted syself, not quite exclusively, to the political assessinations. I have never been in pursuit of a whodusit. By work is a very large study of our basic institutions in time of crisis. In the course of it I have done virtually all the solid work not in accord with the official explanations of the JEX and Hing assessinations. I have begun the deposit of my papers in a major university system. There is contonuing interest in them because mine is substantial work. A week age I had a request for those papers from a large west-coast university. The head of another history department is coming here Vednesday. While the subject has attracted many buts and self-presenters it does make a terming-point in history. Hime is generally regarded as the next extensive and ment dependable work.

It is from this reputation that there were several approaches from European publishers for so to do a Vatergate book. By the time it was apparent that the market did not desire damkking definitive, basic writing I was well into an investigation and writing I did not want to lay saids. I developed information as yet unpublished about some of the central characters. This lod to what was attempted on Er. Douglas, how by when and with what classestine support, thus also to you.

A Vashington associate of Mr. Velfren sent ne to Florida to approach the Welfren foundation for support. My secting with Arvin Rethechild was interfered with by a betting charge laid on him. We spent sens of the afternoon together and with his wife dised that night. He seemed impressed and he said he was. He later reported that the probability of foundation support did not seem high. As I now recall it I had completed a long, heaty and almost entirely surread rough draft while deeply engaged in other work, some thinks to you and Harris v. Melson. I could not abandon theother work and I was surjous for a good editing job for which I could not pay.

Several menths later I was invited to Ocala for the same purposes. Mr. Welfsen was eff with his herses when I reached there. He had a Cuhan or Mexican trainer come at the same time. Just before and during supper ment of the conversation was about herses. At the end of the small hr. Welfsen invited me into the living room to discuss the purposes of my going there. We spent about an hour, often interrupted, in conversation. He had glanced casually at some of the documents I had with me and absurptly terminated our macting by having so unhered to one of the cottages. I have neither soon mer heard from him

since. Before he terminated the audience he did knew the essence of what I had developed relating to the involvement of some of the Waterinte characters with the Mixen-Ford efforts against the Court nembers. When he seemed unable to detach himself from the herses and speeches favorable to those I knew to be charlatans I did ank him to do what he could to make information available to me. This was limited to those Court efforts. Nothing happened. Considering what I had and showed him in solid evidence this was then surprising and now it is more so.

May things suggest themselves. I have no way of knowing whether may is relevant. One example is the timing, the appearance of this story in the first Sunday edition after the change in administrations, the first Sunday Ford is not Fresident. Another is that it was fed to "ob Woodward, whose nea-reporting in Watergate in part accounts for the fact that what I report above is not public knowledge.

I do not know if what I knew is of interest to you. If it is I do got to Washington from time to time. I suppose because of the clots I have been cautioned against injury or jarring. However, eace the weather clears I will be going there for some blood tests if you want to speak to me. Obviously I am asking mething of you.

But I'm serry about this for you. And I do wish you woll.
