I don't believe an Alvarez ought sit on such a body any more than I should. He is a partisan. More, he is parti pris. The can't agree with the HSCA's conclusion without disagreeing with positions he took publicly—and extensively, as on CBS TV specials.

I don't think you'll went more but holler if you do and I'll look for the full files, as I received it from ERDA.

Officourse I think there also is a question: why should an Alvarez accept such an obligation when he knows full well that he is a partisen. We have no lack of real experts in thr land.
