**Liddy Transferred
To Less Rigorous
Federal Prison**

G. Gordon Liddy, the tight-lipped mastermind of the Watergate break-in, was transferred quietly yesterday from the medium-security prison at Danbury, Conn., where he has spent most of the last four years.

His destination was the prison farm at Allenwood, Pa., a medium security institution with no guard towers or fences, a place where prisoners are eligible for three-day to seven-day furloughs.

Peter Maroulis, his lawyer, said Liddy was told late Tuesday that he would be transferred. He is serving a sentence of 6 years, 8 months to 20 years for conspiracy, burglary and wiretapping and is not eligible for parole until May, 1981.

The transfer was made almost four years from the day that Liddy and six others went on trial for the burglary of Democratic National Committee headquarters.

Liddy has spent 46 months in prison, far longer than anyone else connected with Watergate or its aftermath.
