Dear Cyril,

Sometimes it is difficult to tell people things in confidence. Often the confidence is difficult to respect. Therefore, before sending you what I have that I think may interest you, I first tell you that these items must be kept in strictest confidence for several reasons, including the stipulation of the sources. This means to be mentioned or discussed with no one.

One relates to what one of your colleagues is saying about you, personal, unflattering things. One relates to what I believe may be a serious slip Fisher made.

The more I see and learn of him, the more I get the idea that whether or not he enjoys professional respect, Fisher is not a very nice guy. And not honest at all.

They did things not in the panel report.

I have prepared a very lengthy excerpting from your testimony to be added to WFO REPORT III. It is more than the essence. Only the minor things and the most characteristic of them are out.
