

with conspiracy in the case. The motion said Garrison had a policeman deliver a press release on the charge to the news media before the acrest warrant was delivered to California, "giving Bradley time

Dymond said the sole reason for the Bradley charge was "to lend substance to the charges against Shaw."

ALSO CITED were Garrison's national television appearance Feb. 3, a story in the National Enquirer and what the motion called a "nationwide speaking tour" by Garrison.

The defense attorneys said they infer that "the DA operales on the aesthetic theory that by not mentioning the name of Clay L. Shaw at any of these discussions it takes him outside the court guidelines."
