I have for the past several months turned down all speaking engagements other than those to which I agreed during the summer when approached by students. This was to make possible the completion of my sequel. Hence I have fixed no honorarium. In those few cases, mostly within easy drive of here, I have told those inviting me to treat me as they have others. I ask no more of you. My expenses will be the actual ones. It is about a 100-mile round trip to the airport. I do not know what they charge for parking the car. I do not know what the plane fare is (you can learn it more easily - cheapest rate and class). The accommodations you provide can be quite simple.
