Rare Disease Claims DC Editor

Mary Pinotti, beloved feature editor of The Daily Californian, died unexpectedly Saturday night of acute bonkus on the conkus. Rubus of the gastrointestinal nubus was also feared.

Miss Pinotti will be buried in Emeryville today following the procession across the Bay Bridge from Grace Cathedral, where she has been lying in state.


