Deer Mr. Weisberg:

Reference is made to your letter of September 17, 1968, to Mr. Angel concerning the papers identified as Exhibit No. 397 of the President's Commission on the Assassimation of President Kennedy.

The original papers relating to the autopsy of President Kennedy referred to our letter to you of September 13, 1968, are the same papers we motified you in our letter of October 9, 1967, that we had received from the Secret Service. They are (1) one of the signed copies of the typed autopsy report and (2) the papers reproduced in Exhibit No. 397. Copies of these papers were furnished to you at that time.

We assume that your statement with respect to the testimony of the prosector conserning his notes refers to the testimony of Dr. Humes near the bottom of page 372, Volume II, of the Commission's hearings. His testimony on this subject is continued on page 373 and does not support your assertion that Exhibit No. 397 is incomplete.

There was no indirection in the statements contained in our letter of September 13, 1968, and we have so further ecement to add to the answers which have already been given to the questions raised in past correspondence.

There is no index in Commission Document No. 4.
