Mr. Robert H. West, Surveyor, who made the plat maps of the assassination area requested the Bureau to furnish him copies made from the original tracing which he had furnished to the Bureau on 5/31/64. Inasmuch as the Bureau had no authority to comply with this request, the matter was referred to the Criminal Division of the Justice Department for handling.

Mr. Cella, Department attorney, phone 187-2660, called me today and asked if I could determine what it would cost to have six prints made from the tracing which is in the possession of the Exhibits Section. He stated that Attorney Howard Willins who was Administrative Assistant to Mr. Rankin requested this information. Mr. Cella was advised that this information would be obtained and furnished to him.

ACTION:

The Cooper Trent, Inc., 1130 19th St., N.W., FE 8-3800, quoted a price of \$2.10 per copy which measures 42" by 71". The Bureau's Liaison Section originally had copies made gratis by the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for use of the FBI in preparing exhibits for the Commission in June 1964. SA Robert H. Haynes, Liaison Section, advised that DIA would be most happy to furnish additional copies to the Bureau at this time.

Unless advised to the contrary, I will telephonically advise Mr. Cella that six copies of the plat map will be made available to him through FBI sources if he so desires.
