
I recognize that I owe you for the probate of my deceased husband's will and some services prior to December 21, and ask you to send the bill to Mr. Holley's office.

1. Intervenor adopts the allegations contained in paragraphs 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Plaintiff's Original Petition filed herein by Geneva White, Individually and as Independent Executrix of the Estate of Roscoe A. White, Deceased, and as Next Friend of Roscoe A. White, Jr., and Ricky Don White, Minors, Plaintiffs.

2. Intervenor alleges that the damages sustained by Plaintiffs in this proceeding aggregate in excess of Intervenor's subrogated claim against the Defendant by reason of liability incurred by Intervenor pursuant to its policy of Workmen's Compensation Insurance covering the deceased, Roscoe A. White, whose death giving rise to such liability was caused by the acts of negligence of the Defendant as alleged in Paragraph 4 of Plaintiff's Petition.


3. The extent of Intervenor's Workmen's Compensation liability arising out of the death of Roscoe A. 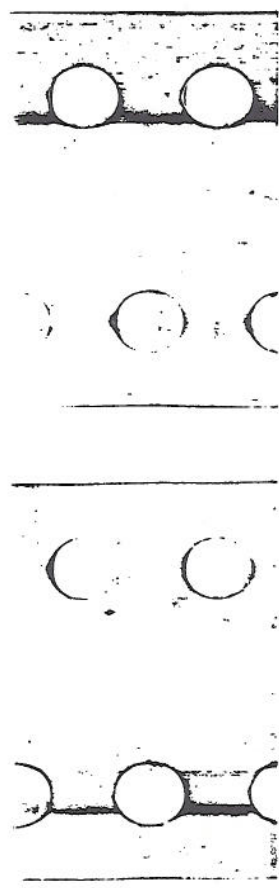

PLAINTIFF'S ORIGINAL PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

1. Defendant is a Texas corporation, having its principal place of business at 2611 South Central Expressway, Dallas, Texas. Its agent for service is MORRIS SHWISS, and its registered address is 208 North Peak Street, Dallas, Texas.
2. Plaintiff is the widow of ROSCOE A. WHITE, Deceased, who was fatally injured by burns on or about September 23, 1971, caused by the explosion of a can of highly volatile and inflammable liquid known as "PC-68" manufactured and marketed by the Defendant corporation.
3. At the time and on the occasion in question, a quantity of such chemical was in a six gallon container in which it was sold and marketed by the Defendant and was stored in the shop in which Roscoe A. White, Deceased, was employed by M&M Equipment Company as a welder and mechanic. While he was so employed and cutting with a welding torch in the shop in which such chemical was stored in the container furnished and labeled by the Defendant, such can of chemical caught fire and exploded, covering the Deceased Roscoe A. White with such burning chemical and causing third degree burns to approximately 90% of his body, resulting in his death on September 24, 1971.
4. Plaintiff alleges that the Defendant was negligent in marketing such can of highly flammable chemical in a container without having markings on such can in large, distinctive colored letters giving sufficient warning that such chemical was highly inflammable, explosive and dangerous in the presence of heat or flame. No such labeling or warning was placed on the container in which the chemical was sold by the Defendant and in which it was



stored at the time of such explosion. Plaintiff alleges that but for the failure of the Defendant to adequately warn of the dangerous properties of such chemical by labeling its container with words of warning in large and distinctive colored letters that such explosion would not have occurred, and in view thereof, such negligence on the part of the Defendant was the proximate cause of the injuries and damages complained of in this petition.

5. Deceased, Roscoe A. White, was a man of 38 years of age, in good health, and earning approximately \$14,000.00 per year as a mechanic and welder, and could reasonably have been expected to continue in such employment with reasonable and customary increases in pay until retirement age of 65 years. In addition, he was a devoted husband to the Plaintiff and father to his minor children, named in this petition, and kept them more than adequately provided with a home, which he was paying for, automobile, food, clothing, medical care, education, recreation, and other necessary and enjoyable family activities for which the family was dependent upon his earnings. Plaintiff alleges that all of this has been lost as a direct and proximate result of the negligence of the Defendant and that damages have been incurred by reason thereof in the following amounts:


