Subj: Commendation

1. On 25 October 1962, the Station Hospi al received an emergency call to respond to the Naval Air Station, Lemoore, Capehart area where a case of possible asphyxia of a dependent child was reported. Hospital personnel responding to the scene discovered Joy Michele Thompson, infant daughter of Joel M. Thompson, YN3, had apparently experienced a convulsive disorder that resulted in cessation of her respiration. Already being at the scene, you recognized the apparent lifeless condition of the infant, and by your alert presence of mind and quick action began mouth to mouth resuscitation. You were able to revive the infant and maintained its life until medical personnel took over. Your composure, and immediate action of applying the knowledge of this life saving procedure, resulted in saving the life of this infant, displaying the highest traditions of the naval service.
