ANNOUNCEMENT OF PRESS CONFERENCE

The J.F.K. Assassination Information Center, Dallas, Texas announced today that a press conference will be held at 10:00 a.m., Monday, August 6, 1990, at its headquarters on the third floor of the West End MarketPlace, Munger Avenue at Market Street in downtown Dallas.

The purpose of the press conference is to announce startling and significant new facts about the John F. Kennedy assassination to the news media and the public. At that time, a team of noted researchers and investigators will disclose the identity of the assassin who fired the fatal shot at Kennedy, and provide supporting documentation and background information.

According to this new information, one of John Kennedy's assassins:

-- was a rookie Dallas policeman who stood behind a wooden fence in Dallas' Dealey Plaza and fired two shots from a 7.65 Mauser rifle;

-- had served in the Marine Corps with Lee Harvey Oswald and was connected with U.S. intelligence at the time of the assassination and subsequently.

-- knew Jack Ruby and got his wife a job at Ruby's Carousel Club two months before the assassination;

-- knew Dallas policeman J.D. Tippit and, in fact, was responsible for Tippit's murder on Nov. 22, 1963;

-- died under suspicious circumstances in a 1971 fire, after making known his desire to sever his affiliation with U.S. intelligence.

The team of investigators who helped develop and document the subject information will be present to give background and answer questions from the media. They wish to make clear at the outset that the new information does not "solve" the Kennedy assassination. It does, however, point the way toward a possible final solution to this crime.

The investigative team will be pleased to cooperate with the appropriate State of Texas legal authorities, and to turn over all of their information-- with the hope that a thorough, honest and official investigation will be conducted.
