Once I decided on and strated a private printing publishing offers, all far in the future, began coming in. I've turned down three in two weeks. We have no distribution arranged yet. I expect to start working on that Tuesday, if I get the press list taken care of in the half day at best I'll have Monday.

Of course, we'll welcome any help we can get. Who knows, maybe it will take and some of the radio people will be interested. Anyway, I haven't forgotten to send you one of the first copies, as I promised.
